1 Supervisors, Mining, Oil and Gas

A. Supervise the activities of workers in underground/surface mines and quarries or workers who drill for oil/gas, operate service rigs or provide oil/gas services

B. Establish work schedules and co-ordinate work activities with other departments

C. Oversee safety of operations

D. Resolve work problems and recommend measures to improve productivity

E. Recommend hirings/promotions

2 Property Administrators

A. Negotiate or approve rental or lease of various properties in a portfolio on behalf of property owners and ensure that terms of lease agreement are met

B. Prepare and administer contracts for provision of property services, such as cleaning and maintenance, security services and alarm systems

C. Co-ordinate the implementation of repairs, maintenance and renovations carried out on buildings and monitor progress and cost of work for property owners

3 Machining Tool Operators

A. Study job orders and interpret blueprints to determine machining operations to be performed

B. Set up and operate machine tools to perform repetitive machining operations, such as turning, milling, drilling, boring, planing, honing, broaching, grinding or other machining operations

C. Verify dimensions of parts machined using micrometers, calipers and other precision measuring instruments

D. Prepare etching solution and immerse metal parts or workpiece in etching solution to remove unwanted portions

4 Information Systems Analysts

A. Information systems business analysts and consultants confer with clients to identify and document requirements, conduct business and technical studies, design, develop, integrate and implement information systems business solutions, and provide advice on information systems strategy, policy, management, security and service delivery.

B. Systems security analysts confer with clients to identify and document requirements, assess physical and technical security risks to data, software and hardware, and develop policies, procedures and contingency plans.
