Education Required

1 Electronic Service Technicians

1. To be an electronic service technician, you usually need a two-to three-year college program in electronics, or a four-year apprenticeship program in electronic servicing and repair, or a high school diploma plus college courses in electronics and on-the-

2. Trade certification for an electronic technician - consumer products is mandatory in Alberta and available, but voluntary, in the rest of the provinces/territories except Quebec.

2 Legal Secretaries

1. Completion of secondary school is usually required.

2. Completion of a one- or two-year college or other program for secretaries or legal secretaries is usually required.

3. Most recent entrants have a community college diploma, and almost 3 in 10 have a trade/vocational certificate.

3 Licensed Practical Nurses

1. To be a licensed practical nurse, you must finish a vocational college or other approved program for licensed practical nurses.

2. You need registration in all provinces and territories and must complete the Canadian Practical Nurse Registration Examination in all provinces and territories (except Quebec).

3. To be an operating room technician, you need either additional academic training in operating room techniques, or on-the-job training.

4 Welder

1. Completion of a three-year apprenticeship program or A combination of over three years of work experience in the trade and some college or industry courses in welding is usually required to be eligible for trade certification.

2. Trade certification is compulsory in Alberta and available, but voluntary, in Newfoundland, Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Manitoba, Saskatchewan, British Columbia, the Northwest Territories and the Yukon.

3. Interprovincial trade certification (Red Seal) is also available to qualified welders.
